For many summers going back decades, Tibshelf has enjoyed a village carnival at which the family can come together and enjoy a day of fun, food and entertainment.

Now, under the stewardship of the Parish Council's Events Committee, this tradition will continue for many more years to come as it is rebranded to the Tibshelf Music Festival!

On Saturday 21st June, residents and visitors can look forward to a fresh twist on a familiar format that will see local acts and music at the heart of the event. Our live performers on the stage include Little Rock, a local duo both under 12 years old, as well as top tributes to Taylor Swift, P!NK, Freddie Mercury and Elvis Presley!

There will also be entertainment in the arena by Jowett School of Dance. a bar, catering vans, Kid's Activities tent, community stalls and much more. Entrance will remain free for all attendees.

A free event programme will also be given out as you enter the sports field. It will provide information on having a safe day, a schedule of events, biographies of the acts and showcase our event sponsors. Thank you also to former Derbyshire County Councillor James Barron who awarded us £250.


What's being discussed at Tibshelf Parish Council

Tibshelf Parish Council meetings are the main way decisions get made, and in this section of the newsletter, we'd like to keep you informed about decisions at the February, March, April and May meetings

- The Parish Council chose to use Woolleymoore Nurseries for the upcoming Hanging Basket display.
- The Parish Council approved the renewal of membership fees to the Derbyshire Association of Local Councils
- A second Automatic Number Plate Recognition camera for the village was rejected.
- Automatic switch-off timers had been installed to the Pavilion heaters to save on heating costs.
- A £200 grant was awarded to St John the Baptist's Church for the Tibshelf Open Garden associated posters,

programme and admin.

- Councillors to take online safeguard training so they know their responsibilities in protecting vulnerable people in the community.
- Tibshelf Warm Space and Social received a grant of £500 towards having a Christmas pantomime show.
- Mock ups of a new Christmas lights display will be provided to the Parish Council to allow them to decide on new lighting.
- The Parish Council agreed to Bolsover's Active Communities Programme and the provision of



- The Parish Clerk to look into options to clear land at the cemetery to allow for better access to the field gate. This includes approaching Remedi, the restorative justice group, to see if young people can assist.
- The Parish Council initiated the co-option procedure to fill the casual vacancy. No election had been called.
- £50 was awarded to the Derbyshire Children's Holiday Centre
- The resignation of the Parish Clerk was revoked.
- A 10% discount was approved for advertisers in Tibshelf News if they buy the annual package i.e 3 adverts for the year.







ANNUAL REPORT - 2024/25

CHAIR'S REPORT

Dear Residents.

Please accept my annual report as Chair of Tibshelf Parish Council, in which I am pleased to highlight what the Parish Council has achieved in the second year of this elected council's term of office. We have enjoyed another extremely productive year that has seen so many events and projects taking place and improving the community. The Parish Council is lucky to have a brilliant team of hardworking staff, a group of enthusiastic councillors and dedicated volunteers who have all worked together to provide much-needed services and much-loved parish events and activities.

Parish Councillors are volunteers from the community who work hard to organise and oversee the Parish Council. A lot of this work happens in the background away from view, but, with reports like this, hard work can be acknowledged.

Key Achievements and Activities

In terms of Tibshelf Parish Council as an organisation, we have introduced new policies & procedures including a modernised Freedom of Information and Data Protection policies and, to reflect our desire to continually develop and improve, we have continued building upon the Council Business Plan which sets out our objectives and actions for the forthcoming years.

We finalised and installed the new playground equipment on the Parish Council Sports Ground, completing the s.106 project that started in the previous year. This substantial improvement will ensure excellent facilities are provided in Tibshelf for residents to enjoy. The Parish Council worked tirelessly with one of our District Councillors and an Officer from Bolsover to ensure the money was spent on time and it is very clear this is being enjoyed by many of our younger resident and families. We have now also installed CCTV to monitor the equipment and the pavilion, providing protection against crime and vandalism. We also undertook treatment to various trees and planted new ones with the help of local schools! To further provide activities for young people, we are trialling the replacement of Extreme Wheels with an 8-day package of trips to Pleasley Vale Outdoor Activity Centre. To fight crime, we signed up to Derbyshire Constabulary's Automatic Number Plate Recognition camera pilot scheme that will see a camera on Mansfield Road, and Tibshelf Neighbourhood Watch is looking to create a speed watch to monitor problem areas.

We have also helped those facing difficulty by supporting the provision of a School Holiday Activities Scheme aimed at children on free school meals and continuing to run the popular winter Warm Space & Social to help those to save money on heating bills and reduce social isolation.

Community Events

The Parish Council created the Events Committee that has been tasked with organising Parish and Village Hall events. It has gone on to organise many of the much-loved community events we all enjoy. This year we had the annual Remembrance Sunday and VE Day event, another incredible fireworks display, Christmas Fayre, Christmas Lights Switch-On, Parish Carol Concert and New Years Eve party. New additions to the calendar include a St Patrick's Day event and Summer Craft Fayre. The popular Sunday Bingo nights continued for another great year. The Parish Council has spent this council year organising a new event, Tibshelf Music Festival, to be held on 21st June 2025. We also put up several displays in the village, including summer hanging basket display, Remembrance poppies and Christmas lights. The hanging baskets display in particular received the most sponsorship money on record! We have also seen our boundary planters kindly planted by a Green Bunch representative.

Tibshelf Village Hall

As trustees of the Village Hall, we continuously work on projects to improve the facility. We were delighted to have successfully applied for a £5,000 grant (along with another grant for £1,000 from District Councillors) for a new kitchen that has now been installed, and we finished decorating the main hall and Parish Office. All of these further modernise the facility after securing the new flooring last year. We also received £500 for a new fridge. We continue to source new tables and are seeking grant funding for a new rear disability entrance ramp, something highlighted in the Accessibility Audit we finished this year also.

Grant Funding to Local Groups

The Parish Council gave out grants to community groups, including St John the Baptist Church and Derbyshire Children's Holiday Centre. Donations were given to Tibshelf Village Hall charity and Tibshelf Tots.

I would like to remind you that residents are invited and most welcome to attend the Parish Council and committee meetings at which you can raise any matter during the 15-minute public speaking section. Full Parish Council Meetings are held on the third Tuesday of the month at 7pm, excluding August, with committees held on other Tuesdays. Our latest agenda and meeting minutes, including a 5 year archive, are always available on our website. Our social media pages and noticeboards will always promote the latest information on meetings, events and activities.







Neighbourhood Watch Wins £250 For Speed Watch

Tibshelf Neighbourhood Watch has been awarded £250 by Derbyshire Police and Crime Commissioner's Neighbourhood Watch Support Fund 2025 for speed watch equipment

On Tuesday 29th April, Tibshelf Neighbourhood Watch, a working party of Tibshelf Parish Council, was happy to be informed their application to the Derbyshire PCC's Neighbourhood Watch Support Fund was successful.

The £250 will go towards the purchase and operation of a Community Speed Watch by the Neighbourhood Watch that aims to target problem areas and improve community safety. The data collected will help Derbyshire Police improve their operations and any speeding drivers could receive a letter informing them they were caught and that they should reflect on their behaviour. Summer Update from the Tibshelf Schools Federation

2025 has flown by so far and we are all enjoying the warmer weather. Across the Infant and Nursery School and Town End Juniors the children have been working hard on their learning and taken part in a variety of events including Science Week, World Book Day, Red Nose Day and lots more! Sport is an area which the children particularly love and the Year 2 children have participated in an Infant Agility competition held at the Secondary School whilst the older children have been involved in dancing at the Winding Wheel in Chesterfield. galas, bowling and district cross country events. As always, they showed a great attitude, good team spirit and either won or were very close . We are also continuing to extend community links such as working with the School Nurses and other agencies to put on different workshops or coffee mornings for parents/carers to pop in and ask any questions on topics they may want to find out more about.

The Summer term is often one of our favourites as the children get to use more of the outdoor spaces which they really enjoy. Our Nursery children are growing a reading teepee, planting vegetables and releasing butterflies. They are very excited about Pinxton Puppets coming to perform! Reception will be thinking about special places and discussing what places make us feel happy and safe. Our Year 1 classes will be investigating what plants need to

grow and will be growing some of their own plants to look after. In Year 2, the children will be learning attacking and defending skills whilst playing invasion games and learning all about travel and transport with a focus on Tim Peake, Helen Sharman, Neil Armstrong and George Stevenson. The Lower Juniors will be learning about Europe and making comparisons to the UK whilst the Upper Juniors will be learning about the local area, it's history and how it has changed. Town End also have a Forest School open afternoon to celebrate the revamped Forest School Area on Wednesday 11th June in the afternoon. We have invited in different groups and charities and have lots of activities organised.

The pupils will be going on a variety of trips throughout the schools, our very youngest children in the Nursery will be visiting Willow Tree Farm and our eldest children going on a residential to Gullivers before they move onto Secondary School. Summer often brings with it more events and sports days, followed by the Summer Fayre held on the field near the Infant and Nursery School. One of the favourite events (and one that has a long line too!) seems to be the wet sponge throwing where the Leadership Team get very wet! However, it is also a bittersweet term in many ways as whilst many children remain with us, we have to say a fond farewell as some move onto a new school. That said, we do often see them again as they do pop back and it is always lovely to hear how they are getting on \odot .

We have a dedicated team of case workers for both adult victims of crime and young victims of crime (Got Your Back), who are here to listen to how you have been affected by crime and offer tailored support. It does not matter when the offence took place or if the offence was reported to the police or not.

We offer emotional and practical support; this is offered remotely over the telephone or by meeting in person for face-to-face support.

History & Civic Society Summer Update

TALES OF TIBSHELF PROJECT

Readers may be aware that the society has successfully secured a Heritage Lottery grant of £72,600 to research, compile and record tales of the working lives of Tibshelf people.

Practically this means we can build upon the work done in our previous Miners to Medics project by gathering insights about the individuals who have called Tibshelf home and engage in activities that highlight the community's rich heritage. The scheme includes learning opportunities for families and young people to help foster an appreciation of the connection to the village's past.

Can you help? If you have any stories or photographs related to Tibshelf that you would be willing to share, we would like to hear from you and your contributions will help inform exhibitions and material we will publish in support of the project. Details of these can be found on the Society's Facebook page (search for Tibshelf Historic & Civic Society) or OUr developing webpage (tibshelflocalhistory.co.uk). We are looking for stories around working people's lives, our rich sporting heritage and local involvement in significant social events. The project includes elements to make our materials more inclusive—including braille book and talking book for the visually impaired, aspects of improving mental health and wellbeing and interpreting the evolving landscape

around us.

This project will keep us very busy through 2026—a year in which we will also celebrate our 10th anniversary.

It will run alongside our Living Memories and Heritage crafting Community Lottery initiative and normal society activities, including liaison with other history groups, exhibitions and outreach talks we provide.

The project will last until March 2027.

We thank village organisations who gave us letters of support leading to the success of our latest bid and hope, with them, we can mutually move forwards to rediscover and record our village history, our members for their involvement and small team of volunteers who make these things happen. For this new project we also benefit from the contacts and resources of Richard Godley as our project leader.

Our Living Memories programme still runs on, regularly attracting a friendly crowd of 35 plus people and we have interesting presentations lined up for the autumn. This aspect of our work will link in with Tales of Tibshelf and share several topics / events.

Over the past 10 years we have certainly moved things forward and thanks to the players of the National Lottery at no cost to the village rates and hope to continue this sustainability, keep our membership fee affordable and add to our collection of published material so that future generations can appreciate the worthy past our predecessors created and lived through and we have recorded.

The Tales of Tibshelf project will certainly help us move up our activities a gear but prove a challenge for our small, enthusiastic band. You are welcome to join us and help with our research as new horizons and opportunities open up.

Our Heritage Crafting group will feature a practical

afternoon of spinning and weaving wool so participants will be able to follow the steps from fleece to material using a spinning wheel and weaving loom to create something. Similar to the days of yore when framework knitting was an all inclusive family activity (but not well paid). The wool felting and needle felting session we held was fascinating fund and this one should be too. Coe along and have a go—good company and it is free!r.

Thoughts of Ivan Brentnall—I wonder if we could couple up a spinning wheel to a generator so us pensioners could generate our own electricity to save on winter fuel bills, keep active and occupied and sell back our surplus supply in sufficient quantity to generate a small income not attracting extra tax lability? If we still had accumulators for our wireless sets, we could certainly charge them up—no, forget it.

New Vicar Update

Many people are asking when are we having a new vicar? The answer to this is we don't know yet. To find a replacement can take anything between 18 months to 2 years. Once Derbyshire Diocese have decided whether to replace Gill or join us up with a neighbouring Parish, they will let us know.

For the time being, I am the point of contact for weddings, funerals, baptisms and any other enquiries. The church remains open and functioning exactly as it was under Gill's ministry. There are 4 Sunday services a month - 3 at Tibshelf and 1 at Blackwell. Coffee mornings have recommenced and are every second Wednesday of the month—10am to 12 noon. And a reminder that our Open Gardens event is on 19th and 20th July.

Spring Patient Newsletter from Staffa Health

Are you using the NHS APP?

It is often discussed at our Patient Participation Group meetings how difficult it is for patients to contact the surgery if they need to cancel an appointment as the phone lines are so busy. There have been many suggestions but unfortunately the ideas have not been suitable to put into practice.

The surgery does send a text message reminder to patients for appointments and from this you do have an option to reply if you need to cancel.

Another way to receive our text messages is via the NHS App. Patients who have downloaded the NHS App can receive messages securely from the practice via the NHS app instead of an SMS (text) message, provided they have enabled notifications. Receiving your SMS messages via the NHS App helps save the NHS thousands of pounds in costs of text messages per year, so please support the NHS by enabling notifications in the NHS App today.


Tibshelf Parish Council held its first St Patrick Day event at the Village Hall with entertainment by singer Wes Dolan
