
What's being discussed at Tibshelf Parish Council

Tibshelf Parish Council meetings are the main way decisions get made, and in this section of the newsletter, we'd like to keep you informed about decisions at the June. July and September meetings

- The Parish Council received applications and co-opted Ben Jones onto the Parish Council
- The Parish Council noted £250 had been received from Derbyshire Police and Crime Commissioner for the speed watch
- It was agreed to buy 10 new lamp post Christmas trees and have 5 new motifs in the centre of the village
- It was agreed the Clerk undertake the **Financial** Introduction to Local Council Administration
- policies and/or New amendments were approved, including: Reserves

Investments. Co-options and Complaints

- The Parish Survey was discussed and a Working Party created to organise it
- The Parish Council considered a response to the Local Government reorganisation
- It was agreed to purchase new publishing software in the anticipation Ωf discontinuation of Publisher.
- Following the success of the 2025 Music Festival, it was agreed to hold one in 2026 and a budget was approved



- Problem speeding areas. such as Chesterfield Road. were noted and information passed to the Neighbourhood Watch for their upcoming speed watch
- Amendments were made to the Communications Strategy allowing a 2-month trial of sharing local group posts as and when they are seen
- Additional tree works are needed at the Parish Council Sports Ground following inspection. Α Tree Management policy was approved
- Following the success of Pleasley Vale trips children, this was renewed again for next year

New community 'Tibby Pick' to help keep Tibshelf tidy

A new monthly community litter pick has been started by Tibshelf Neighbourhood Watch to target areas of the village that might not get covered by other volunteers or councils

On one Sunday a month, volunteers and Tibshelf Neighbourhood Watch members will litter pick problem areas of the village. Using equipment kindly loaned by Bolsover District Council's Street Scene, the first session aims to target the Back Lane, Church Lane and Five Pits Trail. Please check the Parish Council and Neighbourhood Watch Facebook pages for details.

The purpose of the group is to complement existing litter picking done by councils and other volunteer groups to enhance coverage as wide as possible. The group have also been contacted by the Countryside Rangers who will assist with future picks.

Chair Cllr Helen Varney said "It will be brilliant to see the volunteers and members come along and help keep Tibshelf tidy. We will be doing this monthly, so if you missed us one time, there will be another chance!"

Parish Survey 2025 Details & Guidance

Five years on from the success of the Parish Survey 2020, the Parish Council wants to hear your views on a range of new issues, as well as track progress on previous ones!

In September 2020, the Parish Council held the firstever Parish Survey that asked residents a range of questions on the community, crime, housing, Parish Council facilities and the Village Hall. Five years on, it's making a return!

WHAT IS THE PARISH SURVEY

The Parish Survey is an all-encompassing survey to let residents give their views on a range of issues in the village. The 2025 version will let the Parish Council track progress, get your views on new issues and seek fresh ideas for the village. It also assists the Parish Council in forming its Business Plan, a document that outlines projects, plans and objectives for the coming years and how we plan to achieve them. This is available on our website.

HOW TO COMPLETE THE SURVEY

 Two people can fill in the hard-copy survey if they use a different colour pen. A person can fill in an online version found on our website, Facebook or QR code at the back of the survey

- Please mark each box with a single X to signify your selection, or to the left of the box (in a different pen colour) if a second person is filling it in.
- Please can written answers be clear and readable to ensure your ideas are included.
- Please mark just one box per question unless it's stated as multiple choice.
- Please ignore any question you do not wish to answer. For example, if you don't have any ideas for new events, please leave it blank and move onto the next question.

HOW TO RETURN THE SURVEY

Completed physical surveys should be removed from the newsletter and returned to the Parish Office or placed in the dedicated post boxes in the Co-Op and Chemists. Please return by Wednesday 12th November 2025. The online survey form will be taken offline on the same date.

RSV (Respiratory Syncytial Virus) and Shingles Vaccination

Aged 75-79 (or pregnant)? You are eligible for RSV immunisation. RSV is a common cause of coughs and colds. RSV infections usually get better by themselves but can sometimes be serious for babies and older adults.

The shingles vaccine is available to patients who turn 65 on or after 1st September 2023, patients aged 70-79 and patients aged 50 and over with a severely weakened immune system. You can get shingles more than once, so it's important to get vaccinated even if you've had shingles before.

If you are eligible and would like to have either of the vaccinations, please contact reception to book an appointment with one of our nurses.

FLU CLINICS 2025

You can get the free NHS flu vaccine if you:

- Are aged 65 or over
- Have certain long-term health conditions
- Are pregnant
- Live in a care home
- Are the main carer for an older or disabled person, or receive a carer's allowance
- Live with someone who has a weakened immune system

Community First Responders are real lifesavers

What are Community First Responders?

Community First Responders (CFRs) are unpaid Volunteers who can provide vital life-saving care until the arrival of an emergency ambulance. They do not need a medical background and will be trained by East Midland Ambulance Service (EMAS) then work alongside EMAS Staff. They DO NOT replace them. If you answer 'yes' to the questions below, then you are just the sort of person we are looking for and you could make a real difference to YOUR Community.

Starter Plot Initiative Thrives

The second year of the starter plot initiative at Tibshelf Allotments has been a resounding success, with every available plot taken for 2025. Designed to offer newcomers a hands-on introduction to gardening, the scheme has become one of the most popular ways for residents to get involved in growing their own food.

Starter plots are smaller than standard allotments. making them ideal for beginners or for those unsure of how much time and effort is required. Thanks to funding from Foundation Derbyshire, each plot has been equipped with a small shed, basic tools, and a water butt. New gardeners are encouraged to experiment with growing vegetables, fruit, and flowers, while learning essential skills such as planting,

weeding, and harvesting. Support from experienced allotment holders has also played a key role in building the confidence of those just starting.

Participants have thoroughly enjoyed their first growing season, with many describing how rewarding it's been to learn new skills and harvest produce they've grown. Come wind, rain, or shine, the allotments have become a vibrant hub of community spirit, where neighbours share tips, seeds, and even a brew with a slice of homemade cake.

One of the biggest signs of the scheme's success is that over half of last year's starter plotters have now taken on permanent allotments. They've embraced the challenge and commitment of long-term growing, contributing to a record number of active plot holders.

This summer's hot and dry weather has been challenging, requiring regular watering, but the site has still seen plenty of successes — from flourishing flowers to rows of thriving crop, all tended by dedicated gardeners. What began as a simple idea to make gardening more accessible is now helping to grow a greener and more connected community.

With interest continuing to rise, discussions are already underway for the allocation of 2026 starter plots. Each plot is rented for one year, after which participants can choose to take on a permanent plot,


