## Parish Council Awarded £10,000 for Platinum Jubilee Picnic & Party in the Park



We are thrilled to inform you that Tibshelf Parish Council has been awarded £10,000 by the National Lottery Community Fund for the Platinum Jubilee Picnic in the Park event.

A £10,000 grant application was made to the Awards for All England funding programme of the National Lottery Community Fund and put the case that this event will boost community spirit, cohesion, mental health and the local economy.

Organised by the Platinum Jubilee Working Party (pictured above),

comprising representatives from the Parish Council, local groups and residents, this money will go a long way to making the event one to remember. It will take place on Saturday 4th June from 12pm to 9pm at the Shetland Road Recreation Ground (Cricket field).

The day will include live performance art, bands, rides & attractions, games, DJ tent and food and drink, among many other things. Please see pages 12 and 13 for more information about the day and how to get your entrance wristband.

This will be the first opportunity in 2 years to bring together the community and hold an event to recognise the historic achievement of Her Majesty the Queen to be the first Monarch

to celebrate a Platinum Jubilee - 70 years of service - having acceded to the throne on 6<sup>th</sup> February 1952.

The event has been planned to include all residents of the Parish, with activities for the young and young-at-heart, music and performances, crafts and entertainers, and has been supported by local groups and business. This event is free and we hope to see you all there to enjoy the fun!!

And finally, during the last 2 years, the Parish Council has faced many challenges, not only due to the impact from Covid and having to get to grips with the new regulations and working practices, but also internal staffing changes which unfortunately have meant the Council has not always had the ability to meet all our plans. However, I am really pleased to welcome our new Parish Clerk and Responsible Finance Officer - Rachel Tattershaw - to our team. I am sure Rachel and the team will work with the Council to enable us to continue to support our residents and community.

# What's being discussed at Tibshelf Parish Council

Tibshelf Parish Council meetings are the main way decisions get made, and in this section of the newsletter, we'd like to keep you informed of what is discussed.

In January, the Council gave sympathy for Bolsover District Alderman Ken Walker and his wife. The Parish Council would write to the County Councillor expressing concerns village infrastructure would struggle should more housing be placed in the village. The Parish Council would write to the District Council to ensure planning compliance at the King Edward pub conversion. An update would be sought on plans for the High Street flats. The Clerk reported that subsidence damage to the Pavilion was being looked into, and actions arising from the Tree Survey would be completed. The Responsible Financial Officer reported the overall financial position for October 2021 and a monthly statement of payments for December was discussed and approved. The draft



Bolsover would increase tax by 2.68% and would adopt a new code of conduct. Following the adoption of the Neighbourhood Plan at an extraordinary meeting of the Parish Council, an update was given on the next steps, namely the Regulation 14 consultation. The Clerk reported that Extreme Wheels had been booked for the summer. The 2nd tranche of tree works was agreed to be undertaken, and proposals would be developed for a renewed Christmas tree installation for the coming Christmas. The January payments and receipts were accepted. A discussion was held about the need for a new byelaw covering the Shetland Road Recreation Ground. The Communications and Project Officer would research the next steps and if a PSPO would be better. The Officer would also draft up questions to ask Tibshelf Community School children about the village and its facilities. It was agreed to review the hanging baskets decision and Party in the Park £10,000 budget. The hanging baskets would be reinstated, but go between the White Hart and Rock House Farm. The Party in the Park would continue as agreed. An update was given on the Clerk recruitment process.



The meeting held in February 2022

of the Spring Edition of Tibshelf News was approved and the printing and distribution could go ahead in the coming days. It was reported that after the next Neighbourhood Planning Steering Group meeting, the draft Plan would be presented to Tibshelf Parish Council for formal approval. A discussion was held on the future of the hanging baskets, and it was decided to not have baskets for 2022 and ask the public their views on 2023. The Clerk would obtain quotes for the village entrance planters. It was agreed to set up a Queen's Jubilee Picnic in the Park working party and allocate a budget of £10,000.

In February, the District Councillors reported that

In March, a moment of silence was observed for Ukraine and a member of public suggested the High Street flats be used to house refugees. A letter would be sent to Bolsover District Council in support of this idea. Thanks were given to those organising the recent defibrillator courses. ➔

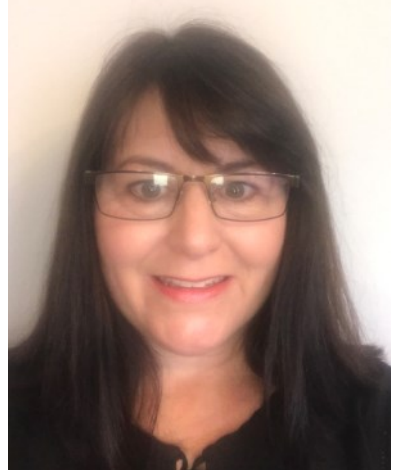

It was agreed to replace the current Members' Code of Conduct with the new Local Government Association Code of Conduct. It was agreed not to move Council meetings back into the Meeting Room, but review this periodically. The payments and receipts were approved for the month of February. It was reported that £4,194 had so far been spent of the COVID-19 Grant money. Tibshelf Tots was awarded a £350 grant, and Tibshelf Allotment Society was awarded £600. The Communication and Projects Officer outlined the upcoming newsletter schedule and it was agreed to survey residents their views on the Christmas lights for 2022. Thanks were given for the Church lights volunteers who would be retiring from their role and an advert for new volunteers would go in the newsletter. It was reported that a National lottery Community Fund grant of £10,000 had been awarded for the Queen's Jubilee event. An update was given on event details. It was agreed to explore grant funding for youth shelters in the village.

Tibshelf Parish Council meetings are held on the third Tuesday of the month, excluding August. They begin at 7pm and last until 9pm, unless councillors agree to a time extension. There are also meetings of the Resources Committee, Village Hall Management Committee, Finance Committee and the Neighbourhood Planning Steering Group.

Parish Council meeting minutes are usually approved at the next Parish Council meeting. If amendments or adjustments are requested by councillors, it could take a further month.

## Hanging Baskets Reintroduced for 2022

---

After receiving feedback from residents on the baskets for 2023, it was clear they were still wanted in 2022. The Parish Council has taken on board the outpouring of support and will reintroduce a High Street display for this year.

Hanging baskets will go up on lamp posts from the White Hart pub in the north, to Rock House Farm in the south. The display will be on lamp posts from June 2022.

Of the responses received to the survey in the last newsletter, 47.5% wanted a full display as normal, 37.5% wanted a partial display and 15% wanted no display. This meant there was a combined majority of 85% for hanging baskets, and a combined majority of 52.5% for wanting to save some money.

### Sponsorship

A lot of feedback we received showed many people wanted to sponsor a basket. Sponsoring



one for £30 could help us raise £1,000 towards their costs and upkeep.

# NHS staff, patients and visitors must continue to wear face coverings in healthcare settings, unless they are exempt



## Summer Update from Staffa Health

---



We hope you are all enjoying living with far fewer restrictions relating to Covid-19 and this is impacting positively on your health and wellbeing. It feels good to get a bit more back to normal. In the surgeries it remains mandatory to wear a face covering and in all other healthcare settings unless you are clinically exempt. Our staff will continue to wear face coverings and appropriate PPE whilst at work. This is to protect both them and you while we are providing your care. Your cooperation with this is greatly appreciated.

Whilst the legal requirement to isolate if you test positive for coronavirus has been removed, we would like to reiterate that it is still recommended.

This will help to prevent the further spread of the virus and an increase in cases again. If you have any coronavirus symptoms please don't come to the surgery. Contact us by the online request form or telephone if you need urgent medical advice. There is still a local 'red hub' open to see and treat patients who are unwell with Covid-19 and we do see patients with Covid-19 or similar symptoms at our Stonebroom surgery following a telephone discussion.

Free LFD and PCR testing for the general public ended on 1 April as part of the Living with Covid plan which set out the government's strategy to live with and manage the virus.

Free COVID-19 tests will continue to be available to help protect specific groups including eligible patients and NHS and care staff. Our staff will continue to test at least twice weekly for the safety of our colleagues and patients.

We have been using our online request system for 10 months now. We hope those of you that have used it have found it useful. We will always take requests over the telephone if you are unable to send an online request. The online request system was launched at the same time as an initial triage by the GP and this has allowed us to deal with a much higher volume of contacts than previously.

We asked a sample of patients who used the service in January to provide some feedback to us about the online request system. There was a lot of positivity about the system and many comments about how well the system was working for people. There were a few themes of areas that were frustrating for people though. We have met as a team and reviewed all the comments and made some changes. For example there was quite a lot of dissatisfaction about having to call anyway to make an appointment after the online request was triaged. We have changed our process and the

receptionists will call a patient now and book that with them. We are also working with the system suppliers on a trial to send a link to the patient to 'self-book' online, so hopefully you will soon see some further helpful some developments. We will continue to make improvements from patients' feedback wherever we can to make the system as helpful as possible for all.

Finally, due to a reducing demand and the tailing off of the National Covid-19 Vaccination Programme the local Covid-19 vaccination centre at North Wingfield Resource Centre will close at the end of March. Vaccinations will still be available through the National Booking Service where needed – please phone 119 or go online to book if you still need a vaccination.

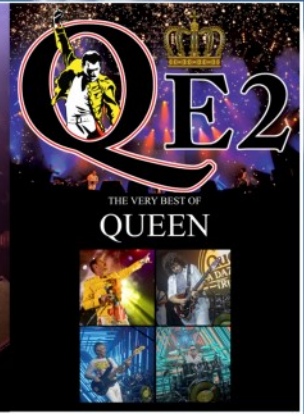

Twisted Oak for those wanting to enjoy different types of drinks.

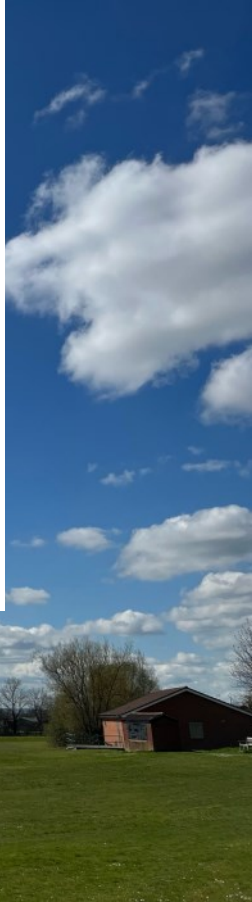

## Comic Relief 2022

This year for Comic Relief our school raised £394! On Friday 18th November we had a Comic Relief day to raise money for the charity. Students had access to a fun event in the sports hall during lunch time. The event included lots of stalls lead by our Prefects and Character Champions, including cake sales, sponge the teacher, tombola, face, and nail painting, kick up challenge, sweet pong, tug of war and much more. The Y11 Prefects and Character Champions were excellent in helping to set up and lead the stalls, communicating with students and staff whilst showing exemplary behaviour. ## Discovery CREST Award

All of the year 8 pupils at Tibshelf School have been provided with the opportunity this academic year to undertake a project to earn a Discovery CREST Award. CREST is a scheme that inspires young people to think and behave like scientists and engineers. The delivery and resources for the project were provided and funded by the Smallpiece Trust. The theme of the project was designing and creating model gliders out of plywood. The pupils worked in small teams to complete the project over five hours and presented their work at the end of the day.

All the pupils each had their own role in the project, putting communication, teamwork and project management skills into action! The days have been a huge success and some fantastic gliders have been built!

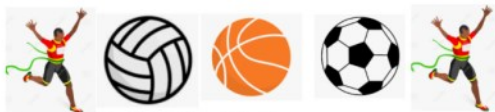
